Item data and all unpublished testing instruments from this study are available at [www.wmich.edu/cpmp/](http://www.wmich.edu/cpmp/) for use as a baseline of instruments and data for future curriculum evaluators or Core-Plus Mathematics users who may wish to compare results of new

groups of students to those in the present study on common tests or surveys.
